GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

Dear Knights and Families,

I am beginning the conversations about the possibility of starting Knights Councils in the three parishes we serve. This came about from a meeting which our DD set up with Fr Thompson who agreed to begin a Knights Council at St Pius. St Elizabeth Ann Seton had previously requested their own council. All three pastors need to agree on this to and more discussion is necessary. There of course is always a request from Supreme for more councils. We need to look at this when and if it makes sense. In any of these scenarios, leaving the council building and 5390 as a St Joseph Council is the only thing that makes sense. There was concern about how the Knights who are not a member of St Joseph and had considerable sweat equity into the building would feel. No one will be forced to join the new councils. This is similar to the way the new Assemblies for the 4th Degree went. Some stayed with their old Assembly. Some Knights would stay with their old councils. This brings up another facet to consider. The new church councils would not just be extra Knights Councils to join if you felt like it. We would need to have considerable buy-in from the whole Council. That is why I am writing about this in the newsletter.

An alternative too having two new councils is to have one new council. Some have suggested that St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish members have the longest trek over to the Marion council building. For this reason, a single new council at St Elizabeth Ann Seton may make the best place to start from. St Pius parish Knights of Columbus, especially new members, could decide to go to the St Elizabeth Ann Seton council. A nice aspect of either St Pius or St Elizabeth is that there is ample meeting space no matter how large the new Councils would be. However it was brought up that the new St Elizabeth Ann Seton kitchen could not support pancake breakfasts for instance. However, this difficulty could be overcome by the new Knights Council. Their first project could be financing a kitchen renovation project. Any such obstacle can be negotiated. Obviously I am not running any financials on this, but rather keeping this topic on all our radar screens. To bring the current membership into the discussion, for the Annual Report of Knights of Columbus Round Table in June 2010 (using the membership list): St Pius has 107 Knights, St Elizabeth Ann Seton has 41 Knights, St Isidore has one faithful Knight, Tom Meade, and St Joseph has 272 Knights (421 total). Our Supreme end of April 2011 reported 488 members.

I started performing an aspect of my job to send in the Family of the Month to Supreme. I got immediate feedback with Kevin and Mary Jo Evers being one of the 100 randomly drawn entries. Supreme is going to send a Holy Family gift for their home. Congratulations! We will honor our council's Family of the Year, Don and Fran Hatfield, and Knight of the Year, Chuck Luster, at our June 27 picnic.

Summer is coming (any day now). Ensure that your faith practices like prayer and mass, even daily mass, stay strong over the summer. Remember how I wrote a while back about doing an Our Father or Hail Mary worth of sit-ups or push-ups or even both in the morning? How is that going? If you have not started, give it a try. It is OK to start off easy.

For instance a web site (military.com) says to graduate into a full blown push up.

- Start standing an arms distance from a wall and push off the wall.
- Next try not doing it with your whole body on the ground, but rather use a table, couch, weight bench, bed or counter to have your hands on.
- Next a short stool or step with your knees bent (a.k.a. girl push up).
- Next to the last phase is knees straight with hands on a step or on a stool.
- Last phase is the push up you used to do "back in the day".

Through all this, increase your reps with the Glory Be, Hail Mary, and Our Father. How encouraging is it to do exercise with prayer! Counting is for the birds!

I will check this out with our Royal Doctor about having our business meeting in the large room so we can have room to pray pushing-up at the meeting first. Knights should be fit physically as well as strong in their faith.
