GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

Dear Knights and Families,

It has been an honor to serve as the Grand Knight with such a fine group of Knights who have been extremely supportive for the past two years. While it has been a lot of work, it is important to stress my gratitude to all who have taken on additional responsibilities, making this position much more manageable. Furthermore, it's been a privilege to fulfill this role in such a truly great organization, which emphasizes the key facets of Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism.

I have learned much about cooperation as a Grand Knight. There is something about the cooperation that happens on an ongoing basis through fish fries, breakfasts and our less frequent special events, which constitutes the **Fraternity** of the order. Along with accomplishing a task, there is camaraderie present making the work more enjoyable. When physical ailments or sickness strike either Knights or their spouses, we come to each others' aid. Of course, the business side of the Knights of Columbus ensures others we leave behind are taken care of through insurance.

Our fraternal work goes to a higher calling of **Charity**. We have a giving ratio of 36% which represent \$34,000 given to charity for MCC and #5390 combined for 2011. This does not count the charitable giving of our time or treasure, for instance when we do not charge rent for certain charity events or cook lunch for the Lay Formation Program. Support for the Ultrasound Initiative at Bridgehaven (formerly Aid to Women) has been added to our list of charities along with our long time support for Birthright, Discovery Living and a host of others.

Unity and Patriotism can be spoken of together in the times we are currently experiencing with the challenge of Health and Human Services conscience protection. Jesus' prayer for the believers is "...that all may be one as you, Father, are in me, and I in you; I pray that they may be [one] in us, that the world may believe that you sent me." (John 17:21) We need to love Mother Church as we love Christ. If there is something we disagree with Mother Church, we need to educate ourselves in the Truth. We can always find something to disagree about, but that does not require virtue. A virtuous person will be willing to stand for the Truth even when it means being opposed to popular culture.

Staying close to Christ in the Eucharist is key to Unity, as is demonstrated in our new 2nd and 3rd Degree. The supporting Sacrament to the Eucharist is Reconciliation. If what we eat is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ, we ought to act accordingly. A pure heart helps our **Unity** be complete. When we keep our focus on Jesus and Mother Church, we have the best chance of getting along with each other.

The Patriotism of Knights is now coming into focus due to the lack of conscience protection from the Health and Human Services mandate. Many in our Church are not following our Church teaching on contraception from Humanae Vitae. Political gains are being made in the public square from this lack of unity. But the public square aspect is encouraging some to look deeper into this and determine that the Church

really is right on this count. It is important to continue to pray and take action on this important Church issue.
