Our January Fish Fry brought in 333 paying customers. A record for January. The spring like weather helped and the word of "the best fish fry in town" is spreading.

The six Lenten Fish Fries beginning February 15th will allow us to maintain our council chambers and provides funds for our churches, seminarians, community and our many other charitable endeavors.

With the larger Lenten crowds, up to 28 volunteers are needed for the 1st shift and up to 22 volunteers for the 2nd shift. This does not include the kitchen crew or dessert ladies. In addition, many come in on Thursdays to set up and prepare the food.

The 1st shift checks in at 4:30 pm and eats when relieved by the 2nd shift at 7:00pm. The 2nd shift eats before their shift and are usually home by 9:00pm.

40 YEARS OF ABORTION

While the first Midwest March for Life (organized by the Iowa Right to Life) was held the day before in relatively balmy conditions, approximately 50 walkers braved frigid 14 degree weather the following day on January 20th to mark the 40th anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court's decision legalizing abortion. The group walked from St. Matthew Church in Cedar Rapids to Planned Parenthood on 1st Avenue, where they were joined by roughly another 18 people. The rosary was prayed in front of the facility in remembrance of the more than 50 million babies who have been aborted in this country since 1973. The March for Life was organized by the Coalition for Life of Iowa.
