GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

I had occasion to hear a sermon that really stuck to me and I wanted to share this with you with a slant toward the Knights of Columbus. As you may or may not know I am a member of St Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish in Hiawatha. Our pastor is Father Mark Ressler. He gives very good homilies at Mass as he taught for many years at Loras College in Dubuque. A few Sundays ago it was time to talk about Time, Talent and Treasure. He mentioned the packets with our names on it where in the vestibule of the church, just waiting to be picked up. He mentioned that we are put on this earth with many gifts from God to utilize in our everyday encounters with other people.

When we think of **Time** we right away look at our schedule and how it is broken up into daily segments that make up the 24 hours in a day. When I ask people "how's it going," I usually get the "fine" or "good" but also many say "I'm busy". Sometimes I ask myself, can I get more than 24 hours out of a day. Sometimes there aren't enough hours in a day to complete the tasks at hand.

Talent on the other hand is something that we develop as we mature and utilize toward our vocation, hobbies, or as a general aid toward our family and friends. I know when I was in high school my father wanted me to go to a two year program by GE to learn how to work on their various products. Treasure is sometimes misconstrued as money or being wealthy.
