DUTIES OF SELECTED COUNCIL OFFICERS

The Chancellor has a variety of responsibilities. Primarily, he assists the Grand Knight and the Deputy Grand Knight in the execution of their duties and oversees the council in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the members' interests in council activities. The Chancellor is Chairman of the Admission Committee and a member of the Columbian Squires circle ceremonial team.

The Recorder is similar to a court reporter or a secretary.

He is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the council and its correspondence. A Recorder's Minute Book is available from the Knights of Columbus Supply Department.

The Guards have similar responsibilities, but distinct differences.

The Outside Guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the inner door, the Inside Guard checks to make sure that their membership cards are current.
