## **SEMINARIAN SUPPORT**

As of our August meeting, our Council is supporting two seminarians (and potentially a third) through the Supreme Council's Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP).

Blake Neebel is originally from Madison, Wisc. His family moved to Dubuque in 1998. They are parishioners at St. Joseph the Worker. Blake graduated from Wahlert High School in 2009. He initially majored in Engineering at Loras College. After a long summer of discernment he answered God's call and entered the seminary in the fall of 2011. He is starting his 2nd year of Theology at the Pontifical North American College in Rome. He could be ordained to the priesthood in 2017.

Tyler Raymond is originally from the Cedar Rapids area. He and his family are parishioners at St. Joseph in Marion. After graduating from Linn-Mar High School Tyler studied European History and Classical Languages/Ancient Civilizations at the University of Iowa. As he discerned God's calling he transferred to Loras College and entered the seminary. He is starting his Senior year this Fall and will graduate in 2015, after which he will enter Major Seminary that Fall. He could be ordained to the priesthood in 2019.

Please keep Blake and Tyler in your prayers as they continue their discernment to the priesthood. Their addresses are on the front page of *The Knight Light*. You are encouraged to send cards and notes. This moral support is part of RSVP requirements in order to receive the \$100 refund for the Council's \$500 donation. ## **STAR COUNCIL AWARD**

Star Council designation is the highest award any local council can earn from the Supreme Council. To qualify for Star Council status, a local council must earn the Columbian Award for programming

- Father McGivney Award for membership
- Founder's Award for insurance
- Completing and filing the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity Report Form (#1728) by Jan. 31 is required for all three awards.
- Participate in at least four First Degree exemplifications

## **COLUMBIAN AWARD — PROGRAMMING**

In terms of Supreme Council awards, the Columbian Award is the only one that requires an application form. Requirements for achieving the Columbian Award are:

- Completing and filing the Service Program Personnel Report Form (#365) by Aug. 1.
- Completing and filing the Columbian Award

Application (#SP7) by June 30.

- At least four (4) major involvement programs each in of the six (6) sections of the Service Program: Church, community, council, family, culture of life and youth.
- Participating in any of the eight “Featured Programs,” and meeting the minimum participation requirements, fulfills all four activity requirements in that Service Program category.
  - Church — R.S.V.P.
  - Community — Habitat for Humanity
  - Global Wheelchair Mission
    - Council — Special Olympics
    - Culture of Life — Ultrasound Initiative
    - March for Life
    - Family — Food for Families
    - Youth — Coats for Kids

### **FATHER MCGIVNEY (MEMBERSHIP) & FOUNDERS (INSURANCE) AWARDS**

This will be determined by Supreme Council records for membership in each council for July 1 to June 30. To qualify a council must achieve its quota for net gain in membership/insurance. 5390 Quota = Net +27 / +10

- Additions will be credited for new members, juvenile to adult membership, reinstatements, reactivations, readmissions and reapplications. For insurance, additions also include juvenile to adult insurance membership and associate to insurance transfers.
- Deductions to be charged against the quota include all suspensions and withdrawals. For insurance, deductions also include insurance to associate membership.
- Transfers in/out of the council and deaths won't be counted for the quota.
