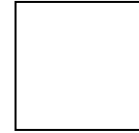

For the first time ever, a 4th Degree Exemplification will take place in Marion. Don't pass up this opportunity to join the ranks of the Fr. John R. Gallagher Assembly in Marion as it goes over 100 members. The 4th Degree is the Patriotic Degree, the highest degree in the Knights of Columbus.

The 4th Degree Sir Knights serve as Honor Guard for the Archbishop and special occasions in the Church such as Conformation, funerals, etc. Honor Guard and Rosary is also provided at visitations for those requesting it. Other patriotic services are also provided in the community such as Honor Guard for veterans returning from the Honor Flight. And last but not least, in memory of a deceased Sir Knight, the family selects a Chalice or Travel Kit for a Priest or vestments, etc. for the Church or money to a Catholic School.
