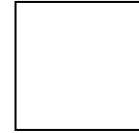

HORIZONS SERVICES

Meals on Wheels program is perhaps the most well-known program. We like to refer to it as our community health and nutrition program as so much of the fresh produce is grown locally. Each day 1100 meals are prepared and delivered to older adults in the community. Not only will they receive a well-balanced meal, they also are receiving a wellness check to assure they are not ill or have fallen. There are several congregate meals throughout the area as well as breakfast bag delivery. The summer meal program for children served over 60,000 meals in the area this summer.

Mental Health & Wellness program offers therapeutic services for individual, couples, and family counseling as well as children, adolescent, teen and group therapy. The family support portion supplies parenting education and life skills building. Early Access offers development, evaluation and service coordination. Our Survivors Program works on homicide and violent crime advocacy for those affected by violent crimes. Last year over 6,000 counseling sessions took place helping over 3,000 people.

Financial Health and Wellness works with individuals struggling with financial issues. The services include budget and credit counseling, debt management programs, housing and homebuyer counseling, bankruptcy education, and financial literacy classes. There are more student debt cases being seen also. Last year 615 clients were counseled and over \$600,000 in credit card debt was paid off by clients.

Neighborhood Transportation Service (NTS) has been providing transportation at night and on weekends since 1994. After the city buses stop operations at 6:00, there is no other public transportation other than a cab. The service is a curb to curb service providing rides to work, school and life skill classes. NTS also transports homeless children to school during the day and provides rides to homeless shelters during inclement weather. Last year NTS provided 46,444 rides to over 1100 people.

MEMORIAL PRAYER SERVICE

November is an important month in the liturgical calendar when the Church celebrates All Saints Day and All Souls Day. Traditionally this is a time to remember our loved ones who have gone before us to the kingdom of heaven.

Since 1965, Council 5390 has offered a Memorial Mass to remember the deceased members of our Council, especially those Brother Knights who have passed away the previous year.

This year we will have a Mass celebrated by our Council Chaplain, Rev. Donald Kumba to honor our departed brother knights. This will be held on Sunday, November 6th at 4:00 PM at our Council Hall. A potluck meal will follow the liturgy. Bring a main dish, side dish or dessert to share.

All Council members are requested to make an effort to join us in this celebration of the liturgy. All family members and friends are invited.
