January is a month of new beginnings and the nuclear family. The epiphany is on January 6th, when the Savior of the World is honored by the Three Kings with worldly gifts. Many families exchange personal immediate family gifts on this day and keep the December events to concentrate on God's gift to the world and enjoy extended family.
