FISH FRY

We served over 500 paying adults on 3 of our 6 Lenten Fish Fries this year. We had a record 563 on March 31st and a total of 2,846 paying adults during Lent. This does not include the reduced kids prices and kids under 5 who eat free. Also excluded are the priests, nuns and widows of KC 5390 who eat free. We again have a 100 year old guest who eats free. And of course over 75 volunteers who weekly prepare food on Thursdays and those who work on Fridays eat free.

Finding 51 volunteers for the 1st and 2nd shifts was actually quite easy during Lent. Especially when the Ken and Paula Ladage family with daughter, Brandy and granddaughters, Becah and Lily worked 5 of the 6 Fish Fries. Many other volunteers worked multiple Fish Fries.

As I was at the State Convention in Dubuque at the last Fish Fry, I was unable to sign up those who would like to work our May 19th Fish Fry. Please call me if you would like to work.

This will be the last Fish Fry that I will be lining up volunteers. It has been enjoyable and I have met many good knights and families during my years calling and working with the volunteers.
