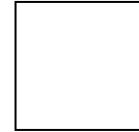

Every one of our parish staffs does incredible work to actively achieve growth in the faith (the good soil). Of course, we know the people who need exposure to the scriptures the most are the ones not in attendance. What can we do ?? Pray; yes. Attend; yes. Make eye contact & invite someone to participate: oh boy.

That leads me to the recent whispers about the St Joes FUN DAYS making a return to the annual "community" calendar. The two Dads were very sharp and on top of the actuality that the event is developing a budget that has to be successful for the event to continue, but the reason for going through all of this effort was not for fund raising, but for connecting with the community and being an inviting faith community just as the mission statement states for each parish on every bulletin.

Imagine if there were such scheduled sessions there put on by "Theology on Tap", or "That Man is You", or the "Widows Group", or "Men At Church". The Knights of Columbus exist to protect / support Holy Orders and to assist each parish.

HALL RENTAL FEE INFORMATION

The Hall is available for wedding receptions, anniversaries, birthday parties, Christmas parties, luncheons, etc. The following chart outlines our rental fee guidelines. As members of Council 5390, we receive some nice discounts on rental fees. We also get discounts on bar items.

Rental fees:

Friday: non - members: \$450; members: \$100.

Saturday: non - members: \$500; members: \$300.

Sunday: non - members: \$400; members: \$100.

Monday - Thursday:

non - members: \$50 per hour, 2 hour minimum;
members: \$50 flat rate.

Cost for a member using the hall for a special anniversary 25 years or more: free any day (limit to one per month). The special member rates apply only to Council 5390 members and their immediate family members. Because of the nice discounts we receive as members, we are asked to help with set up and clean up.
