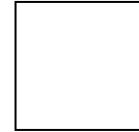

GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

October is a preparation month. We all know what's coming: The Christmas Season & winter weather. It arrives every year. And continuously, each parish has wonderful preparation groups that meet regularly that bring you a terrific social atmosphere. Would you consider being part of something special and unforgettable for just six months? See your Parish bulletin or contact the Faith Formation Director individually. Just something you will cherish forever, but not until you go through that first six months open heartedly. That is a pitch I took from my message one year ago.

Our parish groups make for great preparation in our faith habits. One of the many ministries at each parish is music. You will never regret or forget your experience when you join one of these music ministries, even if it is for just one year. You will meet & converse with awesome active parishioners while developing your confidence in singing at Mass. That confidence will become a habit in your faith action which will last the rest of your life. Other people will notice and compliment you at unexpected times, okay, mostly when you are attending other churches in other zip codes. It is a fine-lead in to a discussion when you visit other parishes to find out about the people attending that parish every Sunday.

I sing now at every Mass I attend. With confidence, I can complement the choir or cantor on each occasion. This was not always the case. During my teenage & college years I was reserved and resistive to standing out in my faith (how typical). One thing that stuck with me from my nuclear family (the First Church in our Faith) was that my Dad sang every time. Every Mass he sang and could not carry a tune. I have no talent in music, but I could realize that. In my Catholic education, we had grade school music and then one semester of required music in high school. I could barely make out the notes on a scale. That was all of my formal music training. From my Dad, I saw faith in action and he never told me to sing, but Mom gave that nudge every so often that only a Mother can do. In time, I made the conscious decision to sing at every Mass and almost every song. I still will say I have no talent in singing, but I do have some developed skill from my time in one of the Church Choirs for a couple years. May you one day experience this beautiful confidence in singing at Mass as I do now for the rest of my life.

Heaven is a prepared place for a prepared people. Pray, Give, and Prepare with actions.

Continue to develop your personal relationship with the Savior of the World and a great way to break the silence is the Holy Rosary.

Continue to be awesome Knights.

The Hall is available for wedding receptions, anniversaries, birthday parties, Christmas parties, luncheons, etc. The following chart outlines our rental fee guidelines. As members of Council 5390, we receive some nice discounts on rental fees. We also get discounts on bar items.

Rental fees:

Friday: non - members: \$450; members: \$100

Saturday: non - members: \$500; members: \$300

Sunday: non - members: \$400; members: \$100

Monday - Thursday:

non - members: \$50 per hour, 2 hour minimum;
members: \$50 flat rate.

Cost for a member using the hall for a special anniversary 25 years or more: free any day (limit to one per month). The special member rates apply only to Council 5390 members and their immediate family members. Because of the nice discounts we receive as members, we are asked to help with set up and clean up.
