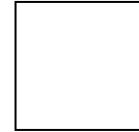

June is the month where we relax a bit while keeping our landscaping tidy. Dad's day is in the midst of it. I am a single, no kids, never been married man in a very busy world.

MCC HALL USAGE

An incident on Friday, May 11th, when Linn-Mar High School had our hall reserved for AP testing, has come to MCC attention. A member of Council 5390 came to use the kitchen. The Linn-Mar instructor did not know the man, but reluctantly did let him in later after testing was finished for the day at 12:30. The member used the kitchen to prepare food for an outside event not related to the hall.

The purpose of this article is to restate the guidelines for our members who wish to use our hall. 1) Check availability by calling the hall reservations chairman. 2) Sign a contract. 3) Pay the member rental fee. On a Monday through Thursday the fee is \$50. A Friday or Sunday is \$100. A Saturday is \$300. By following these guidelines the hall is reserved for you.

We do not allow people to use our kitchen for cooking. We use it for our own club purposes.

Any club member who has knowledge about how to use our kitchen equipment and wants to use our kitchen for his own purpose must follow these guidelines: 1) Get permission from the MCC officers. 2) Contact the hall reservation chair for availability. 3) Sign a contract. 4) Pay a rental fee of \$50 on a Monday through Thursday, \$100 on a Friday or Sunday, \$300 for a Saturday. 5) The fryers are not available for use. 6) Clean the kitchen after use. This includes equipment used, the floor, counter tops, etc.
