Thanks to Howard Schiffer's fore thought and generosity, we are going to use a rust killer and preventer coating on the crosses. This coating will absorb the rust and prevent new rust from forming. This should make the paint last longer so we won't have to work on the crosses as often. It also takes less prep with a little sanding and scraping instead of grinding off the old paint and mildew. EASTER REFLECTION

The gospel for Friday of the Fourth Week of Easter (2019) is from John (Chap 14:1-6); which includes a well-known phrase: "I am the way and the truth and the life". (Jn 14:6) These words of Jesus within John's Last Supper Discourses, can be considered as a basis for the theological virtues of faith, hope and love.
