UNDERSTANDING THE EUCHARIST

A July 2019 survey conducted by the Pew Research Center¹ shows that half of American Catholics know what the Catholic Church teaches on transubstantiation - the belief that during Mass, the bread and wine become the actual flesh and blood of Jesus Christ.

The other half of Catholics incorrectly think the Church teaches that the bread and wine used in Communion are symbols of the body and blood of Christ. In addition, 80% of Catholics age 40 and under think they are just symbols.

Given that Transubstantiation is a core tenet of the Catholic faith, this should be of concern. The misunderstanding may have resulted from confusing theology, poor catechesis or an indifference to it. Young people leave the church, partly because they don't believe the doctrine (or teachings) of the church.

So, what can be done to enhance the understanding of the Eucharist? *Better Catechesis* of our youth. Parents and Grandparents are the primary teachers of our children. The significance of the Eucharist needs to be instilled in them.

Read the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC 1322-1405). The Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life." (CCC 1324); "the summary of our faith" (CCC 1327). At the Eucharistic Consecration, the bread and wine, by the words of Christ (said by the priest *in persona Christi*); at the elevation, through the invocation of the Holy Spirit become Christ's Body and Blood. At that moment we bestow the True Presence of Christ. While it still looks like a wafer and wine, we need to base and accept this tenet through the faith bestowed by the coming of the Holy Spirit at our baptism.

Jesus Christ is the source of our salvation; He is the source of eternal life. In the Eucharist, we meet Jesus' dual nature - divine and human; in the Eucharist we come to the body, blood, soul and divinity of Christ. The Eucharist sustains the life given to us in baptism; it provides for us spiritually. When we receive the Body of Christ / the Blood of Christ, our response, our "Amen", affirms that we agree.

So, what can we do to increase our spirituality and reinforce this teaching on the Eucharist?

Remember the pious and reverent practice of genuflecting when entering the church and pew. We are entering into the real presence of the Eucharistic Lord in the tabernacle.

Reflect on St. Paul's 1st Letter to the Corinthians "whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily" (1 COR 11:27). If you discern your Spiritual soul needs restoring, go to Confession before receiving the Eucharist.

Worship God in the liturgy by attending Mass, including daily Mass when able.

During Eucharistic Adoration we are in a spiritual communion with Christ.

Recognize the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist in order to recognize and serve the poor. All of this is needed to understand the Eucharist
