## THE HOLY SPIRIT WITH US

Pentecost, when the apostles receive the Holy Spirit "which appeared to them tongues as of fire" (Acts 2:3; Jn 20:22) concludes the church's Easter season. For those who remember the series of Star Wars movies, 'The Force" plays a prominent role in the story line; with a 'good side' (think Luke Skywalker) and a 'dark side' (aka Darth Vador). In one sense, the Holy Spirit may be thought of as a force that permeates our lives.

The Holy Spirit is especially at work in the family sphere. Author Scott Hahn says: "Christianity, is the only religion whose one God is a family". The Spirit guides us in our mission as husbands, fathers and Knights of Columbus.

Praying for the Spirit to come upon us helps to discern and to be more aware of the movement of the Holy Spirit in our lives. It can be a prayer as simple as "Come, Holy Spirit".
